"It's like I'm starting over"

Randy learns to forgive himself and repair the damage

When Randy's marriage of 18 years fell apart, he turned to alcohol to cope. "It became an addiction," he says. "I eventually lost my home, my vehicle, my boat, my family. But at that point I didn't care. I was more concerned about where my next drink was coming from."

"I wouldn't be alive today if it weren't for the Mission."

It would be years before Randy hit rock bottom, and in the meantime, his addiction destroyed everything he loved. He was in and out of jail and in and out of homelessness.

"There's so much shame. You can't look yourself in the mirror. It just breaks you," Randy says.

His family tried to help him for years, but he says he burned every bridge he had and they finally had no choice but to shut him out. "I have two grandchildren I've never met," he says, choking up. "Thinking about



them leaves a hole in me."

After trying other programs and failing, Randy found his way to the Mission, and thanks to people like you and your support, we were able to take him in to our recovery program.

Randy recently celebrated a year of sobriety, rekindled his relationship with his Mom, and is ready to try again with his kids and be a grandpa to his grandkids for the first time.

"This program has meant life to me," he says. "It's like I'm starting over. I have so much to look forward to and to build. I've accepted what I've done and my addiction and I'm better for it."

On the road to hope

Frank started drinking when he was 21, socially at first, but it got out of control as he got older.

He has always loved the work he does in IT, thinking on his feet and solving problems. So when he was laid off 15 years ago, it sent him on a downward spiral.

"It was the day after Christmas, and I was kicked out of the place I was living. I drank my last penny away." – Frank, recovering alcoholic

"I had good severance and plenty of money in savings, but emotionally, I couldn't get past it," Frank says. "In every job I ever had, I was stepping up, advancing in my career and then this big setback hit."

He spent his newfound free time drinking more

and more frequently and even getting a few DUIs. Frank bounced around from job to job, continuing to drink. He was divorced in 2013 and hit rock bottom soon after.

"It was the day after Christmas, and I was kicked out of the place I was living," says Frank. "I drank my last penny away. I had quit my job because I was drinking all day and I didn't want to drink and drive and I wasn't going to quit drinking."

Frank lived in his car for a while and then when his family saw the condition he was in, they brought him to the Mission for help.

Frank still has a long road ahead of him to recovery, but for the first time, he's hopeful. "I feel different — mentally and emotionally and spiritually," Frank says. "This is the first time I've taken recovery seriously."

Sheldon learns to escape from "panic mode"

"It feels like night and day"

Sheldon has battled addiction most of his life, starting back when he was just 11 years old.

"I'd drink with my dad and did weed and methamphetamine with my brother a lot back then," he says. "I was a really bad meth addict by 16."

Sheldon says when addiction takes hold, it dominates your thoughts and when you can't get the drugs or alcohol you want, you go into panic mode.

"It's a dread I'd feel inside. I'd feel a complete panic. My mind races. I'm completely lost. I don't even know who I am — my only mission is to drink," he says. "It's panic mode. You sweat, you run, you hide. You're paranoid." When Sheldon walked into the Mission about a year ago, it wasn't his first time. But it was a completely different experience. Before, he said, he was just going through the motions, thinking about how he just needed to get a job and then he'd start drinking again. He never intended to stay sober.

But this time? "I've noticed a huge improvement in my attitude," Sheldon says. "It feels like night and day. Now I have hope that I can live a semi-normal life without being in panic mode."

Sheldon couldn't be more grateful for the support people like you have given him to make his recovery possible. *"For you to give up your money, your prayers and your heart, it means so much. Thank you."*
