"The stress just lifted"

A family gets the chance to pick themselves up after tragedy

Rest risten and her husband have a big family, but they've always been able to make ends meet. Then the unthinkable happened and everything changed.

While moving into a new place, Kristen's 4-year-old son fell into a pool. "He suffered what they called a non-fatal drowning. He was on life support for a week and in a coma for two and a half weeks," Kristen says. "He survived, but he has no fine motor skills. He can't walk or talk. He can't take food by the mouth. He'll need support the rest of his life."

After the accident, Kristen and her husband spent so much time with their son that they lost their jobs. "They said I wasn't stable enough to work," she remembers. It didn't take long before the family lost everything. They ended up bouncing from friend to friend, eventually sleeping in cars and even breaking into vacant apartments just for safe shelter.



Thanks to your generous support, Kristen and her family were able to receive the help they needed.

"It got to the point where I couldn't feed my kids. I was failing. I told my husband we had to go to a shelter because we could not live like this any longer. We had to get past the stigma of homeless shelters. So we came to Las Vegas Rescue Mission," she said.

Kristen says the kids hadn't eaten all day. It was mid-July and they were hungry, hot and exhausted. "Right away, they said to us, 'Come get out of the heat, get some water and cool down. We'll find a place for you.""

"This place saved my life"

A grateful former client gives back to help others

Today, Geoffrey works at the Las Vegas Rescue Mission. But just a few years ago, he came here in the back of a police car with an ankle monitor on.

Geoffrey didn't have a typical childhood. His dad was a Harley mechanic and biker who worked hard all week and partied harder all weekend. His mom was a drug dealer.

"I wouldn't be alive today if it weren't for the Mission"

"Drugs weren't just a way of life — they were our livelihood," Geoffrey says. "As far back as I can remember, maybe 4 years old, I remember seeing drugs on the kitchen table."

Geoffrey started doing drugs at just 12 years old. And eventually he followed in his mother's footsteps, until he wound up in jail.



Thanks to your support, Geoffrey was able to enroll in a recovery program that gave him a new path in life.

When he was released, he had nowhere to go, so police brought him here to the Mission. After attending a chapel service, Geoffrey says he had "a soulawakening epiphany." He realized the road he was on would never lead to anything good. So he enrolled in our recovery program, and that's when everything changed.

"I wouldn't be alive today if it weren't for the Mission," he says. "The year before I enrolled in the recovery program, I overdosed three times. This place — and the people who support it — saved my life."

Matthew finds help and hope in our recovery program

Atthew grew up in a small town where opioid abuse was prevalent, and his friends were no exception.

He started with prescription pain medication and moved on to heroin. His addiction brought him to Vegas when his parents could no longer watch him ruin his life.

He tried many times to turn his life around — he even joined the Marines. But that led to a dishonorable discharge when he was caught using drugs.

When Matthew brought the woman he loved into his addiction, he knew he had to change. He tried

other rehab programs, but Matthew says, "They didn't stick — I think because God wasn't present in those programs."

So he turned to the Mission for help. Now he's in our recovery program and feels hope for the first time in a long time. "Addiction has taken everything from me," Matthew says. "But I already feel a change. I know my future holds something better."

Matthew says he's reconnecting with his family and has a support network unlike anything he's ever had. "It's like family — a brotherhood," says Matthew. "This place means so much. The Mission truly saves lives."
